Synopsis of the paper Charles Shirreff – A Life of Disappointment

In this paper the life of Charles Shirreff, referred to as "the real founder" of Freemasonry in Jersey and "the chief actor in the revival of Freemasonry in Shropshire" has been extensively researched for the first time.

Born in London but taken as an infant to Nova Scotia, Charles Shirreff joined the army and became a Freemason at Louisbourg. He was an early Royal Arch Mason and during the Colonial War was granted a patent as a Deputy Inspector General in the 'Rite of Perfection'.

Shirreff married the daughter of a Jersey merchant, travelled to the island and constituted there the Union Lodge No 1 which continued working until 1813.

Retiring to England as a half-pay Major, his ambition was to become a Provincial Grand Master but he was thwarted by a lack of cash as well as cachet. As Deputy Provincial Grand Master for Shropshire, Shirreff was responsible for constituting several Craft Lodges in that Province as well as in North Wales and Staffordshire. One of his Lodges continues to work to this day.

There is little doubt that he introduced the 'Rite of Perfection', his "ne plus ultra", to Senior members of the Premier Grand Lodge, in particular William White, Grand Secretary and James Heseltine, Grand Treasurer. However, Robert Wentworth Little's assertion that Shirreff brought the Red Cross of Constantine to England is improbable.

A man of "blundering forwardness", with a burning passion for Freemasonry, he eventually fell out with his Provincial Grand Master and was removed from office. Almost two hundred and fifty years later, it is Shirreff's memory that is toasted in the Salopian Lodge No 262. His nemesis is almost forgotten.
