Synopsis of the paper

The Masonic Allusions in James Joyce's Ulysses

James Joyce's *Ulysses* was published in 1922 and is acknowledged as one of the most important novels in English literature. It contains numerous references to Freemasonry and the central character of Leopold Bloom is identified as a Freemason. Freemasonry does not otherwise form an integral part of the plot, although one important chapter contains extracts from Masonic ritual which are utilized in a succession of fantasy sequences. These Masonic allusions have been largely ignored by academics who specialize in literary criticism. Whereas Joyce's references suggest an empathy with Masonic values, academic commentators seek to minimize the relevance of Bloom's Masonic connections instead of exploring Joyce's rationale for including such references as an element in the storyline. The novel and the place of Ulysses in the canon of English literature provides an insight into contemporary attitudes towards freemasonry which this paper explores.

Tim Blakemore was born and bred in Coventry and educated at King Henry VIII school before taking his Law degree at University College London. He practised as a solicitor in Coventry and Nuneaton and was initiated into freemasonry in Wyley Lodge, No. 3836, where he followed in his father's footsteps by becoming Master.
