## To receive and discuss a paper by Prof. Aubrey Newman PROVINCIAL GRAND MASTERS IN THE 18<sup>th</sup> CENTURY

Non-masons are most welcome to join the visit, lecture and dinner.

From almost its beginning the Grand Lodge of London and Westminster faced two problems. Originally concerned with various Lodges in and around London it received a number of applications firstly from Lodges all over the country and then from all over the world asking for recognition from London. It was then faced with a request from Lodges in Chester asking that London give recognition to a locally elected Provincial Grand Master. Agreeing to such requests led by the end of the eighteenth century to a substantial growth in the number of such Provincial appointments, even where there were no Lodges recognised by Grand Lodge. Simultaneously there were a number of individuals, especially Thomas Dunckerley, who held the office of Provincial Grand Master of a number of Provinces at the same time and who did much to lay down the pattern organisation which emerged during the nineteenth century.



W Bro Aubrey Newman, OSM, PJGD, is an Emeritus Professor of History at the University of Leicester and the author of many acclaimed Masonic papers. He joined Quatuor Coronati Lodge in 1990 and became WM in 1998.
