

Synopsis

The Knights Commanders of the Sun and Nineteenth-Century Anti-Catholic Fraternalism

Founded around 1875 by the prolific California Mason, Edwin Allen Sherman, the Knights Commanders of the Sun blended elements from the uniformed fraternities such as the Knights Templar and Knights of Pythias that were gaining in popularity throughout the post-Civil War United States. Using rare primary sources, Adam's paper uncovers the little-known Order's fraternal and Masonic influences, militant religious and political worldview, and its ritual that dramatized President Abraham Lincoln's assassination.

The Speaker

Adam was born and raised in northern California. He graduated with a BA in Cinema from San Francisco State University and an MA in History at California State University, Los Angeles. For several years he was the collections manager for the Henry W. Coil Library and Museum of Freemasonry at the Grand Lodge of California and, most recently, the executive director of the Oakland Scottish Rite Historical Foundation and manager of the Valley's library and archives. Adam was initiated in San Francisco in 1994 and is a Past Master of Phoenix Lodge No. 144. Additionally, he is a Former Master of Northern California Research Lodge. In 2023, he was invested with the Inspector General Honorary Thirty-Third Degree of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite, Southern Jurisdiction, USA. He is a past president of the Masonic Library and Museum Association and The Philalethes Society, and a Fellow of the latter; he is also a former editor of the Scottish Rite Research Society's quarterly bulletin, The Plumbline, and its annual transactions, Heredom. Adam was elected to full membership in Quatuor Coronati Lodge in 2017. Fascinated with the obscure and sometimes controversial aspects of fraternal organizations in the US (and particularly California), Adam has published a number of essays and enjoys presenting at lodges and symposia.

The meetings of the Lodge are held on the Second Thursday in November (Installation), Third Thursday in February, Second Thursday in May and September, and the Fourth Thursday in June.

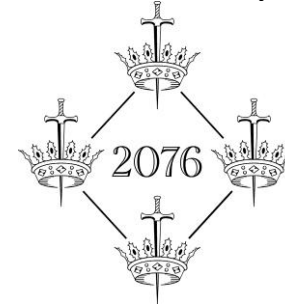
